Please remember that Lyndon streets are plowed and/or salted on a priority basis. Thru roads, major intersections and hills receive first consideration. All streets are plowed only if a snowfall of 4" or greater has been reached.

# Fraud Alert COVID-19 Vaccine Scams



With the distribution of vaccines for Covid-19 now underway, it is important to be aware of scams seeking to take advantage of the elderly and other vulnerable populations. Seniors should be particularly vigilant for callers, texters or visitors seeking money or their private information in order to receive a vaccine.

This month the United States Department of Health and Human Services issued the following tips to protect yourself from Covid-19 fraud:

- You will NOT be asked for money to improve your ranking for vaccine eligibility
- Government and State officials will NOT call you to obtain personal information in order to receive the vaccine, and you will NOT be solicited door to door to receive the vaccine.
- Medicare will NOT contact you to offer you Covid-19 related products
- Do NOT respond to or open any text messages or hyperlinks from unknown senders
- Be suspicious of any unexpected calls or visitors offering vaccinations, tests, or supplies\*

## LARGE-ITEM TRASH REMOVAL

A few residents have recently inquired about rules of the large-item, garbage collection in Lyndon. Please contact Rumpke (568-3800) at least 24-business hours before your regularly scheduled collection day to request a large-item pickup (furniture, appliances, televisions, etc.). A customer service representative will explain how to properly prepare the item for removal. Mattresses, box springs and upholstered furniture must be wrapped and sealed in plastic prior to collection. Appliances that contain Freon must be certified by a professional to have it removed. Visit www.rumpke.com for additional details. Only one large item a week will be accepted with our contract.

Multiple items or piles of junk will not be accepted through our contract. According to federal law, Rumpke is not permitted to accept batteries, tires, liquids, combustible materials or any items identified as hazardous with any service. Also, materials including drywall, concrete, bricks, dirt or rocks are

not acceptable.
