Beautification Committee Meeting Minutes

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:32 PM by Mayor Brent Hagan.

2. Roll Call

3. Approval of Minutes

4. Old Business

- Trash Can Decorating Contest:
The committee discussed replacing worn trash cans with decorated 55-gallon drums as a cost-effective alternative to standard cans (\$1,000 each).
Motion: To approve the purchase of the 55-gallon drums.

Vote: All in favor — motion carried.
- Funding Letter Draft:
A draft funding letter to community partners, prepared by Linda Cambron, was reviewed.
 - Linda presented the letter to the committee.
 - Christina Faulkenburg suggested shortening the letter for easier readability.
 - The committee agreed to provide edits and revisions by the next meeting for final approval.

5. New Business

Committee members shared observations from visits to neighboring parks. All members are asked to email photos to Mayor Brent Hagan for compilation and display at the next meeting.

6. Open Floor Discussion

- **Playground Recap:**

Mayor Brent Hagan provided an update on the Robsion Park playground structure proposal:

1. In 2021, the City of Lyndon received COVID relief funds, which were redirected after a pickleball project partnership fell through.

2. The current playground structure, with a lifespan of approximately 30 years, is nearing replacement.

3. The City of Lyndon has allocated \$2 million for Robsion Park improvements.

4. The playground replacement is the City's top priority before additional park updates.

5. The City is currently obtaining quotes from Play Pro, Game Time, and Bluegrass Recreation for new playground equipment. Mayor Hagan will coordinate in-person presentations for the committee (dates to be determined).

6. Committee and volunteer feedback for Robsion Park improvements included:

- Eco-friendly materials and design
- Nature play structures
- Farmers Market area
- Food truck venue and parking space
- Expanded trail systems

- **Farmers Market Proposal:**

- Jennifer Davis proposed hosting a Farmers Market at Robsion Park.

- The committee recommended submitting a formal proposal to the Lyndon City Council to explore budgeting and logistics.

- Mayor Hagan approved a pilot pop-up Farmers Market at Robsion Park in Spring 2026.

- **Eco-Friendly Garden and Grant Opportunity:**

- Jade Goering presented a grant opportunity for funding an educational eco-friendly garden.

- Christina Faulkenburg proposed creating a "Forest Friends" program in partnership with the YMCA, to be hosted at Robsion Park. Program data and curriculum could support Jade's grant reporting.

7. Next Steps & Action Items

- Committee members to email playground photos to Mayor Hagan.
- Committee members to submit funding letter edits to Mayor Hagan prior to the next meeting.
