**Ethics Committee Working Group Minutes** 

Date: Wednesday, August 27, 2025

Time: 10:00 AM

Location: Lyndon City Hall

#### 1. Call to Order

Chair Mera Kathryn Corlett called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM. All committee members were present:

- Mera Kathryn Corlett, Chair
- Malick Diallo, Secretary
- Calvin Shaak, Member

Additional attendee: Council Member Becky Rickets.

## 2. Ethics Complaint Process

- Reviewed timeline: respondents have 20 days to file a written response.
- Hearings will include introduction, presentation of complaint, attorney-led interviews of complainant/respondent, committee questions, deliberation, and vote.
- Complaints are public once filed, but members may not discuss them outside official proceedings.

#### 3. Standards of Conduct Discussion

• Committee agreed to begin revisions with **standards of conduct** rather than conflicts of interest.

- Emphasis on: fairness, honesty, adequate attention to duties, and professional behavior.
- Agreed to add clause: "When in doubt, seek an advisory opinion."
- Language will be concise, supported by examples, but flexible for unforeseen cases.

#### 4. Gifts

- Committee debated value thresholds.
- **Decision:** Limit personal gifts to **\$300 annually from any one source**, consistent with financial disclosure forms.
- Gifts to the City of Lyndon are permitted if transferred to the city.
- Campaign contributions and nonprofit donations require clarification with legal counsel.

# 5. Use of City Property

 Members agreed that city resources (property, staff, or equipment) may only be used when equally available to the public.

# 6. Representation of Interests

- Officials may not represent or appear on behalf of private individuals before city government.
- Determined this belongs under standards of conduct.

## 7. Political Activity

- Consensus: City officials and employees may not engage in political activity while on duty, in uniform, or using city resources.
- Discussion also covered supervisors pressuring subordinates for campaign activity or contributions; members agreed this is improper, though already restricted under federal/state law.

#### 8. Outside Employment

- Reviewed KLC model language.
- Noted potential conflicts with state law regarding police and National Guard service.
- Consensus: Outside employment concerns are primarily HR/management issues and may not need to be included in the ethics code.

## 9. False Statements / Reputation

- Considered language prohibiting false or reputation-damaging statements.
- Members expressed concern about chilling free speech and generating unnecessary complaints.
- **Decision:** Exclude this language; rely on broader standards and First Amendment protections.

#### 10. Attendance & Honoraria

- Discussed proposed rules on meeting attendance and prohibiting honoraria for speaking.
- Consensus: Not an ethics issue; belongs in council or personnel policy.

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# 11. Training and Professionalism

- Committee supports offering ethics and communication trainings for council and officials.
- Possible facilitation by Kentucky League of Cities (KLC).
- Future meetings will address communications and social media use.

#### 12. Public Comment

Council Member Becky Rickets raised questions about attendance, use of city property, financial disclosures, and op-eds. Committee noted these issues for future clarification and/or training.

#### 13. Adjournment

Meeting adjourned at 12:15 PM.
