MOSQUITO PREVENTION



The Louisville Metro Department of Public Health and Wellness uses a scientific approach to control mosquito populations in our area called Integrated Mosquito Management (IMM). Surveillance, source reduction, biological controls, larvicide (eliminating mosquito larvae) and adulticide (eliminating adult mosquitoes) are methods they use to reduce the mosquito population in Jefferson County.

Draining water from containers around your yard is the most effective way to reduce mosquitoes.

Fogging missions are scheduled on a case by case basis after evaluating several factors that include disease presence, mosquito population density, and special human population

- Bats will eat mosquitoes but really prefer other larger flying insects instead.
- Bug zappers attract mosquitoes to your yard.
- Citronella candles and mosquito plants do NOT deter mosquitoes!
- Mosquitoes are attracted to sweat and lactic acid that is given off when you exercise.
- Mosquitoes are attracted to CO2, which is the air you breathe out.
- People who wear lighter colored clothing get bitten less than those who wear darker clothing.
- Only female mosquitoes bite.
- There are 52 mosquito species in Jefferson County. Not all mosquitoes bite people.

You can do many things to protect your family from mosquitoes. Remember the 3 D's: Drain, Defend, Dress.

DRAIN: Drain containers that hold water in and aroundyour yard. By removing water, you eliminate places where mosquitoes lay their eggs.

- · Gutters- Remove leaves and debris.
- · Flowerpots- Pour out water from trays.
- Grill Cover- Ensure water doesn't pool on top.
- Baby pool- Empty water every 7 days.

- · Birdbath- Change water each week.
- Leaky faucets- Repair any leaks in faucets, hoses, or spigots.
- Tires- Drill holes in tire swings to allow water to drain.
- Trash cans- Keep lids on tightly. Drill holes in the bottom to allow for water to drain.
- Containers- Remove water collecting in buckets and toys.
- Ponds- Keep pools and ponds adequately treated.
- Insect repellents

DEFEND: Wear EPA approved insect repellent that contains Deet, Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus, IR3535, or Picaridin. Always follow the instructions on the product label.

DRESS: Wear long sleeves and pants, closed toe shoes, and avoid perfumes and scented lotions.

Other things you can do:

- Place a fan out doors when sitting on your porch. Mosquitoes are poor flyers and cannot fly against heavy winds.
- Maintain lawns by trimming hedges, keeping grass cut and removing heavy vegetation.
 Mosquitoes like hanging out in shady spots and places where vegetation is thick.
- Keep grass clippings and leaves out of storm drains and catch basins. As the grass breaks down, the mosquito larvae feed on the organic material.
- Clean out your ditch to keep water flowing.
 Stagnant water creates a perfect place for mosquitoes to lay their eggs.
- Repair or replace your window and door screens.
- If you can't remove standing water, use mosquito dunks found at most hardware stores.

Your city tax bills have slightly changed format. Please look at the dates below the amounts at the bottom of the bills. To avoid confusion, we highlighted this sample bill to show you the differences. Yellow amount (discount) is due by August 1, 2019, the blue highlighted amount

(gross amount) is due by October 1, 2019 and the green (delinquent amount) is due by November 1, 2019. It is also clear on the stub what is due if paid before the dates indicated. When you pay your tax bill, please insert the small section (stub) when you mail your checks.

DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

According to the City of Lyndon Code of Ordinances, solicitors and peddlers must obtain a license from the City. Failure to comply with City ordinances may result in revocation or suspension of a license and licenses are valid only for the period specified.

If you display a sign which is posted near the entrance to a home or business that reads "No Solicitors" or similar wording, it legally prohibits uninvited people from selling goods or services or seeking financial contributions, even if they hold a license issued by the City of Lyndon.

A copy of the license issued by the City must be carried by each solicitor/peddler. They must also have a name tag visible, which should include the name of the business for which they are representing.

In Lyndon, permitted hours for door-to-door sales are 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Solicitors/peddlers cannot harass, intimidate, abuse, or threaten residents. If a solicitor or peddler is told to leave, he or she must comply. If you have a concern, residents should call Graymoor Devondale Police Dept. dispatch at 502.327.2677
